School Term Ends

The second term of school ended on March 17th. We are so proud of our students, teachers, and staff for all their hard work. We know that school has been especially challenging this year for the students because of their long break due to COVID. We appreciate the effort that all our students put forth and their positivity.

Our term ended on a high note as the 8th graders went on a school trip to the zoo. They saw many animals, did some fun activities, and enjoyed a special treat with lunch.



Jesus Film Update

The Jesus Film is a video about the life of Jesus and the heart of gospel in the pokot language. This is the most efficient way we have found to spread the gospel in the area, and it has had life changing effects. When COVID precautions began about a year ago we stopped taking *The Jesus Film* out for safety reasons.

The Pokot administration team has worked hard to problem solve and find the safest way for us to continue evangelizing in our neighboring communities. A few weeks ago was our first trip out into a neighboring village with *The Jesus Film*. They brought masks made in the sewing house, provided portable handwashing stations, and set up outside. The film was projected onto the side of a van for a nearby village. Approximately 80 people from the village came and watched *The Jesus Film* that night. The team was able to take the film out again last week, and 90 people came to watch. Everyone is incredibly happy to be able to safely share the story of Jesus again.



Security Wall Progress

Work on the security wall has continued. Depending on the amount of extra hands that are available, about 80-100 feet of the security wall are completed each month. It cost \$300 to build 10 feet of wall. There is still a need for funding for the security wall. The goal is for the entire compound to be surrounded by the wall. This would increase the safety of our compound and our children.



Agriculture Program

Ag classes have been added to our school curriculum. We will be using part of the shamba (garden) behind the school to teach our students how to garden. This program may be helpful in teaching the next generation how to use their own piece of land to provide for their families. We are still working out the details on the best arrangement of the plots and the most efficient way to haul the necessary water for the Ag program and the Feed A Fish program. While there are still details to be figured out, we are excited at the prospects of another way to address food insecurity.

Relief Food

Our Relief Food program currently feeds 509 people each week. The chief helps us determine who are the neediest in the community to comprise our list of recipients. There is a long waiting list of people hoping to receive Relief Food in the future. One way for us to be able to get more food to more people is for supporters of COPE to help. It cost about \$13 a month per person to distribute relief food. While that seems like a small number it adds up quickly when you consider the hundreds of people waiting to be added to the distribution list. If you would like to help fund our Relief Food Program, it is guaranteed to make a tangible difference in many lives.

The Good Samaritan Program

We are still looking to expand funding for our Good Samaritan Program in the form of sponsors. One of the largest deficits in our budget for 2021 is our lack of sponsors for the children in the Good Samaritan program. The children in the program have been determined unable to afford to go to school. It costs \$40 a month to sponsor a child. This pays for their school fees, supplies, uniforms, meals, and medical needs. You also get to communicate with the child you sponsor in the form of letters.
